Thus the need for a sustainable method of development to achieve the goal of a 'positive and lasting development of our planet's resources and population'.

² Sustainable Livelihood is a job that gives a decent income, gives some status in society and some dignity and meaning in life. It also conserves and, if possible, regenerates the environment. It provides opportunities for people to work right in their own community instead of having to migrate to the slums of a big city. 
- Dr. Subhrankar Mukherjee, Managing Trustee, Sankalpa Trust is the Principal Investigator;

3 Multi-Stakeholder Assessment for RIO +10 (Earth Summit) Assessment

Sankalpa Trust was selected as a partner organization by **Development Alternatives, New Delhi** to conduct the consultations for the **Multi-Stakeholder Assessment for RIO+10** (*Earth Summit*) **Assessment** of **local development in West Bengal**. The Sub-regional Forum was held on November 10th 2001 at the Meeting Hall of the Administrative Building, Office of SDO, Bashirhat, West Bengal – attended by local government officials and prominent NGO representatives (Report # SRC.A21.02 will be made available upon request) - the objectives being to:

- Exchange experiences and discuss common concerns and issues;
- · Consolidate recommendations for action, and
- Explore opportunities for sub-regional cooperation to advance implementation with respect to mutual sustainable development concerns.

4 Other socially relevant projects

4.1 <u>'Computer-Based Training Programs'</u>

Sankalpa Trust is directly involved in the production of **'Computer-Based Training Programs'** for the large-scale dissemination of electronic and web-enabled information services in socially relevant topics including:

- Primary education programs for children in rural communities;
- Environment-friendly and socially beneficial rural energy projects;
- · Poverty eradication and the creation of sustainable livelihoods;
- Women and gender-related issues.

4.2 'Orissa Cyclone Relief & Rehabilitation Fund'

Worked with the 'Orissa Cyclone Relief & Rehabilitation Fund', in Kara Kanna Village, Orissa - which was virtually wiped off the ground during the last 'killer' cyclone in Orissa. Sankalpa Trust toured the cyclone-hit areas and provided technical support to a group of Mahila Samities (Women's Organization) in the construction of eco-friendly buildings, crèche development, income generation schemes, installation and provision of renewable energy products & services, amongst other socially relevant projects.

4.3 Divya Chaya Trust

Sankalpa Trust is working closely with **Divya Chaya Trust (DCT)** – a public charitable Trust founded in 1985 to provide care, education and skills to under-privileged women and children, and which is one of the most eminent of its kind in Calcutta. Sankalpa Trust is providing the technical and management leadership in the following projects:

- 'Multimedia Center for the Girl Child', at Karam Bhoomi, Women's Rehabilitation Center at Rajarhat, West Bengal (a rural sub-urban area of North Calcutta). This multimedia facility will be targeted towards the children of the Rajarhat area in general, and the girl child in particular. The objective is to empower and promote self-confidence and assertiveness amongst a segment of society that is intrinsically one of the most disadvantaged.
- **'Eco-friendly Cooking Project'** involving biomass briquetting technology, for groups of up to 30 children who stay at the *Karam Bhoomi* complex for one week at a time to attend socially relevant activities such as seminars, workshops & cultural functions.



• **'Environment Development Project'** at their school center in Behala (a rural sub-urban area of South Calcutta), especially in pond regeneration, cleanup and control.

4.4 People First, New Delhi

Sankalpa Trust has signed an **MOU** with **People First**, **New Delhi**, a premier social activist group in this country committed to social upliftment. Sankalpa Trust is involved with activist programs and the formation of special interest groups to promote the cause of social awareness in the Calcutta region in particular, and the Eastern India region in general.

4.5 Sankalpa Publications

Sankalpa Publications, a member of Sankalpa Trust, is a platform for the publication and dissemination of socially relevant and educational materials, that may not find favor with commercial publication houses, who have to be more concerned with financial viability rather than service to society, which is the prime concern of Sankalpa Trust.

4.6 Minority community development at Budge Budge, West Bengal

Sankalpa Trust is working with a **minority community** at Budge Budge (a rural suburban area of South Calcutta), to raise funds for integrated community development, including:

- Introduction of the following environment friendly technologies:
 - Hand-made paper products making unit;
 - Hydroform Brick-making Technology from fly-ash, which is freely available from a nearby CESC Electric Power generating plant;
 - Microconcrete Tile Making Technology.
- Building of a nursery school and crèche within the project area to empower the women of this community.
- Internet technologies and IT-enabled services for the local community.
